Feed the Need

PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Family and Friends of FUMC,

I recently came across an article in a boating magazine that shared tips for entering an unfamiliar harbor. One of the tips stood out to me: "Follow the leader—or don't." Boaters might feel safe following the boat ahead of them while navigating an unknown channel, but the author warns against assuming that the captain of the boat ahead knows what they're doing. He writes, "Certain boaters know just enough to be dangerous." However, there's an exception to this rule: commercial vessels like charter fishing boats, dive boats, or commercial fishing boats. These boats enter and leave local harbors almost daily and are alert to any changes in the water—things that recreational boaters might not notice. By observing how these experienced captains approach an unfamiliar harbor, you can quickly learn what to do and what to avoid. The lesson is simple: you must know whom to follow when entering unfamiliar waters.

When Jesus said, "Follow me," to Simon and Andrew, then James and John (Mark 1:16-20), it might have seemed like they were doing exactly what the boating article warned against. Simon, Andrew, James, and John were local fishermen. They knew the waters, the best fishing spots, and how to navigate the channels and harbors. They were experts in their routine. On the other hand, Jesus had no experience as a fisherman. Yet, he called them to follow him so that he could teach them how to fish for people.

What's remarkable is that they all immediately followed. They left behind their nets, their boats, their families—everything that gave them comfort, security, and familiarity. Fishing was their livelihood. They knew how to fish, where to sell their catch, and how to return to the safety of home each night. By leaving it all behind, they let go of everything they knew about life. They began a new journey, learning a new way of living—a life defined by the Kingdom of God. As we begin 2025 together, I believe this story speaks to us as a congregation. We, too, are in this boat together, entering unfamiliar waters. We can't know for certain what lies ahead, both in our individual lives and in the life of our church. As we prayerfully discern God's leading—especially with the Capital Campaign for our Steeple Restoration Project—we are navigating new territory.

And yet, I have great confidence that we, like the disciples, will move forward with faith. Jesus calls us to follow him, not because the journey will be familiar or easy, but because he leads us to the Kingdom life. He is the one we can trust, the one who knows the way, even when we don't.

I pray that in this new year, we will follow Jesus with purpose and clarity, that we will trust his leading, and that our journey will not only bring us closer to the Kingdom but also inspire others to join us. May we step forward together, in faith, into this new harbor where God is waiting to do something beautiful among us.

FUNC HERITAGE HAPPENINGS

In June of 1964 certain pieces of real estate on Portland St. and Central St. were acquired. This was done to immediately relieve the shortage of rooms for the Church School and for an increase in income.

Upon the recommendation of a twelve member committee on Research and Planning, and with the encouragement of Rev. William Sleamaker, a Capitol Funds Drive was initiated to provide for a much needed building to accommodate the rapidly growing Church School.

In the Spring of 1965, the land and building adjacent to the Church suddenly became available. After a few weeks of negotiations this property was acquired for \$59,000 (\$591,243 in 2024 dollars). Plans for the renovations of the concrete block structure were prepared by Hershey Associates of Durham, NH.



The building was insulated throughout, partitions and ceilings were installed and a new brick face was put on the front of the building. There were nine rooms available for Church School, a recreational room in the basement which would serve as a meeting room for MYF, sanitary facilities and storage space. This entire project, excepting the brick front, was accomplished under the direction of Wendell Nickerson at a cost of about \$12,000 (\$120,253 in 2024 dollars). Many people devoted time and energy to this effort. The building was consecrated and occupied in December 1965.

Sick Day Chicken Noodle Soup

1 TAB avocado or olive oil

1 lb. boneless, skinless chicken breast, cut in to 1/2" pieces

1 TAB chopped garlic

2 tsp Finely chopped fresh ginger***

1/2 tsp salt

I TAB white miso

8 cups unsalted chicken broth

3 cups egg noodles (6 oz)

1 cup frozen mixed vegetables

1/4 tsp crushed red pepper

2 TAB thinly sliced scallions

Heat 1 TAB oil in a large dutch oven over medium heat, add chicken, cook, stirring often, until no longer pink, about 5 minutes. Add garlic and ginger, cook stirring about 1 minute until fragrant.

Add miso and 1/2 tsp salt; stir to coat. Stir in 8 cups of broth; bring to a boil over high heat. Add three cups noodles and frozen vegetables; return to simmer over medhigh heat, cook, stirring until noodles are tender and chicken is cooked thoroughly, about 8 minutes. Stir in scallions and crushed red pepper.

***Ginger substitute= 1/2 tsp ground ginger = 1 TAB fresh
